

"Men at some times are masters of their fates; The fault, dear Brutus, is not in our stars, But in ourselves..."



#### **Fundamental Thesis of Astrology:**

The positions of the "planets" (all planets, the Sun, and Moon, plus other objects defined by astrologers) at the moment of birth can be used to determine the subject's general personality traits and tendencies in temperament and behavior, and to indicate the major issues which the subject is likely to encounter.

Can this be so? Can we test this? How?





### **Some Questions**

### **But still....**

- many practicing astrologers think they are doing accurate and scientific work - they are not
- most are not consciously trying to deceive the public
- "good" ones can provide effective psychological counseling

## A Stringent Test of Sun Sign Astrology:

Carlson 1985: Double-blind test of personality and birth-charts

- Subjects
  - given California Personality Inventory (CPI) exams
  - birth charts prepared by NCGR astrologers
  - asked to pick from 3 chart interpretations (1 right, 2 wrong)
- NCGR Astrologers (National Council of Geoseismic Research):
  - given one birth chart and CPI results for 3 subjects
  - asked to pick correct CPI results for charted subject
- Agreed beforehand between astrologers and scientists:
  - Success: 50% should be right in both groups
  - Failure only about 33% should be right in both groups

Results: Subjects: 33.7% ± 5.2% Failure at the 3

Astrologers: 34.0% ± 4.4% sigma level

### Science vs. Pseudoscience

- Scientific disciplines provide
  - Falsifiable Theories
  - repeatable experiments
  - open books
- Pseudoscience practitioners frequently
  - quote unfalsifiable theories
  - fixate on trying to discredit solidly demonstrated science
  - shun objective tests of their claims
  - do not provide details of their work
  - are either self-deluded or intentionally deceptive

### • Examples:

• phrenology, mediums/ESP, aura-reading, UFOs, palmists, creationism, "intelligent design" ...
